 It was decided to do two phases: ground works phase and construction of the building in a separate phase to ensure there are no delays with the contractor.
- Working with the consultation firm, Stantec. Leadership of Lhatko First Nation has confirmed they want the project to move forward.
- There is a 3 month delay of construction (due to the found human bone). Delays are not uncommon in capital projects and thus far budget is covered by project contingency planning.
- Discussed service improvements as a result of the project, including flow through departments, enhanced access for patients, and better service-delivery environments for nurses and physicians who support both ER and ICU. Recruitment and retention of staff may be positively impacted with the improvements this project brings.
