New health workforce strategy

The Government of BC is launching a <u>new health workforce strategy</u>, with actions starting in 2022-23. The multi-year strategy will support patients and staff by adding more doctors, nurses, and health sciences professionals; adding new education and training seats; and taking actions to improve retention and to help with workload.

Coroners Report for Illicit Drug Toxicity Deaths (until the end of August 2022)

The number of illicit drug toxicity deaths in August 2022 equates to about 5.5 deaths per day. In August 2022, there were 169 suspected illicit drug toxicity death, which represents a 14% decrease from the number of deaths in August 2021 (197) and a 12% increase from the number of deaths occurring in July 2022 (193). In the NW 33 people have died due to illicit drug toxicity deaths, 59 in the NI, and 15 in the NE. Illicit drug rates in NH have increased this month, and death rates in all other health authorities have decreased.
