Case numbers are updated every Monday and Thursday, and locations of potential exposures are listed on the BCCDC site as well. Measles is highly contagious and can be very serious with almost 1 in 10 people being hospitalized. Getting immunized with at least two doses of measlescontaining vaccine is the best way to prevent measles and potentially serious complications like pneumonia

or encephalitis (inflammation of the brain). For information on how and where to get immunized, visit the measles page on our website. If you have a fever and rash, and think you may have measles, especially if you have been in contact with someone with measles or traveled to an area with a measles outbreak, talk to a healthcare provider. As always, if you are feeling ill, please delay social visits to long term care settings or acute care patients in Northern Health facilities.


