COVID-19

Proof of vaccination card

"The BC Vaccine Card will allow vaccinated people to conveniently and securely show their proof of vaccination at higher-risk social and recreational events and settings when new COVID-19 vaccine requirement rules take effect on September 13, 2021. This will help increase vaccinations, while protecting people in these settings, keeping businesses open and allowing events to take place."

COVID-19 Numbers

As of September 7, **9,371** cases have been reported in the NH region since the beginning of the pandemic.

- Cases currently active: 703
- New cases: 82
- Currently in hospital: 29
 - Currently in ICU level care in hospital: 15
- Deaths in the NH region since the beginning of the pandemic: 161

Illicit drug toxicity deaths for June 2021 now available

On August 31, the BC Coroners Service released a <u>report on the illicit drug toxicity deaths for</u> <u>June 2021</u>.

Summary:

June 2021 (N=159) was the second highest number of deaths ever recorded (June 2020 N=185).

In June, NH have the second highest rate of illicit drug toxicity deaths in the province with a rate of 45 deaths per 100,000 individuals

Northern Health Summary:

NH saw 6 illicit drug toxicity deaths in June (~25 deaths per 100,000 individuals)

- **NW** has seen 16 illicit drug toxicity deaths in 2021 for a rate of 42.1 deaths per 100,000 individuals
 - There were 3 deaths in June
- NI has seen 33 illicit drug toxicity deaths in 2021 for a rate of 44.7 deaths per 100,000 individuals.
 - There were 3 deaths in June
- **NE** has seen 16 illicit drug toxicity deaths in 2021 for a rate of 48.7 deaths per 100,000 individuals.
 - There were 0 deaths in June
