Ensuring everyone has access to food is an important part of the COVID-19 response. The following table offers potential funding opportunities for community based food programs. If you know of, or represent, a community based organization that supports food access, some of these grants might be helpful.

The grants are organized into the following funding opportunities:

- Indigenous and First Nations
- Provincial grants offered to communities and local governments
- Agriculture planning and support
- Schools and school-aged children
- Federal funding
- Large scale funding for community food systems planning

Each grant has specific eligibility guidelines, so be sure to read the information in detail.

Current priority is to support charities in the Lower Mainland and the Fraser Valley , but accepting requests from areas outside those two regions to help assess need and determine when to expand our criteria. Funding will be offered as flexible operating grants that allow charities to maintain or expand services to vulnerable populations affected by quarantine, closures, shortages, access to services, loss of income, or other economic impacts.
