COVID-19 vaccine clinics for Tumbler Ridge and area



Seniors aged 70 and older (*temporarily* until phase 2 clinic appts are booked), and Indigenous peoples aged 65 and older, who are not living in independent or seniors' supportive housing can begin to call and book their appointment through the Northern Health call centre, according to the staggered schedule below.

The Tumbler Ridge clinics will run March 24, 2021 at varying times at the Community Rec Centre (second floor meeting room). You can expect your appointment duration to be approximately 10 minutes, with an additional 15 minute wait time before leaving the venue.

There may be variation in this info to the provincial schedule, as a result of Northern Health's small population sizes in some communities.
