
### DRUG CHARACTERISTICS

#### Substance

A green substance sold as “down”.

Test results show high concentrations of para-fluorofentanyl (twice as strong as fentanyl).

#### Colour



Green

#### Response

Linked to sudden overdoses with prolonged sedation.

### OVERDOSE SIGNS




Slow or NO breathing.



Choking, gurgling, or snoring sounds.




Person isn't moving. Can't be woken up.



Lips & nails may look blue or grey



Skin feels cold or clammy.



Pupils are tiny.

Hours: 7 days a week, 8:15 am to 12 pm, and 1:15 pm to 6:30 pm (OPS until 6:30 pm)

Nursing services: 7 days a week, 8:15 am to 12 pm, open clinic hours from 1:15 pm to 6:30 pm

Mobile Harm Reduction Supplies (wellness/outreach truck) 7 days a week, 7 pm to 11 pm

##### Two Doors Down

Address: 1126 3<sup>rd</sup> Ave, Prince George

Hours: Tuesday to Saturday, 8 am to 1 pm; Tuesday to Friday, 5 pm to 9 pm (Sample drop off available during OPS hours)

Drug checking: Tuesday to Saturday, 12 pm to 4 pm

#### Have a safety plan:

- ✓ Don't use alone, use with someone you trust
- ✓ If alone, use the Lifeguard or BeSafe app
- ✓ When possible avoid mixing drugs or mixing drugs with alcohol
- ✓ Carry and know how to use naloxone
- ✓ Test a small amount and go slow
- ✓ Take into account a potential decrease in tolerance and isolation due to cold weather
- ✓ **Call 9-1-1 or your local emergency number right away if someone overdoses**
