Northern Peer Support Grant: Investing in peer-run organizations

The Northern Peer Support Grant program invested \$110,000 into five peer-led organizations that promote <u>harm reduction</u> and address substance use challenges across Northern BC communities. Peerrun organizations are uniquely positioned to reach people who may not engage with healthcare services and can offer a range of support services tailored to the needs of their communities.

The following organizations show a strong commitment to reducing harm related to substance use and use innovative approaches to support people who use drugs:



Northern Peer Network Gathering 2022

- Coalition of Substance Users of the North (CSUN) Quesnel creates mentor roles for People with Lived and Living Experience (PWLLE) that enhance services at their Overdose Prevention Site and expand support services.
- Uniting Northern Drug Users (UNDO) Prince George creates job opportunities for peers and provides a safe space for people who use substances. Their mobile outreach program includes overdose response training and the distribution of naloxone and harm reduction supplies.
- Society for Narcotic and Opioid Wellness (SNOW) Dawson Creek holds biweekly meetings and events for peers, distributes harm reduction supplies, and focuses on community work, peer mentorship, education, and training.
- William Morrison is creating a peer-led organization in the Northwest. The main priority of this group will be to work with PWLLE as stewards for change and to create a range of supports that meet the needs of PWLLE in the Northwest.
- Society for Narcotic and Opioid Wellness (SNOW) Fort St. John has a Peer Outreach Team available five days a week and engages with peers in the community.

Funding Opportunities

Food Systems Program Grants Deadline: August 8, 2023

The <u>Food Systems Program</u> supports food sovereignty and security efforts for First Nations communities throughout BC. Grants of up to \$5,000 are available to support communities in that effort. It is also a great opportunity for networking and knowledge sharing.

Main Street Revitalization Planning Program Deadline: August 11, 2023

The Northern Development Initiative and Trust <u>Main Street Revitalization Planning</u> <u>Program</u> provides local governments with funding to complete downtown revitalization planning and result in a community-wide vision for the downtown, and an action plan that identifies ways to achieve the vision.

Community Climate Transitions Innovation Fund Deadline: August 24, 2023

Are you doing local climate work and looking for funding to start or scale your project? Advance community-led climate action and innovation with the Tamarack Institute's <u>Community Climate Transitions Innovation Fund</u>.

Climate Change Adaptation Program Deadline: September 22, 2023

The Natural Resource Canada's Climate Change Adaptation Program is soliciting proposals for cost-shared projects that will make important contributions to advancing adaptation progress in Canada. Up to \$15 million in funding may be awarded through this <u>Call for Proposals</u>.



Community Gaming Grants Deadline: Application deadlines vary

<u>Community Gaming Grants</u> provide \$140 million annually to not-for-profit organizations throughout BC., to support their delivery of ongoing programs and services that meet the needs of their communities. Local organizations can apply for up to \$125,000, and Regional/Provincial organizations can apply for up to \$250,000.

Climate Fund Finder Deadline: Ongoing

Planning a climate action project? Need financial support? Not sure where to start? The <u>Funding Finder</u> is the tool for you. By answering a few questions, you'll be on your way to learning which programs fit your program best. If you're still looking for project ideas, the Funding Finder can show you a range of possibilities to help spark your imagination.

Emergency Preparedness and Response Funds - Older Adults Deadline: Ongoing

United Way has released <u>Emergency Preparedness and Response funds</u> to help communities better support older adults and Elders during times of extreme weather events. This grant supports organizations, local governments, and First Nations communities in their efforts to plan for and respond to extreme weather emergencies through practical, innovative, and/or low-barrier solutions.

Northern Healthy Communities Fund Deadline: Ongoing

The <u>Northern Healthy Communities Fund</u> (NHCF) supports initiatives that assist healthy, sustainable, and resilient communities facing rapid and large-scale economic development and associated need for enhanced social services. Projects in communities that are nearby the Coastal GasLink and LNG Canada projects are eligible. This fund has both capital and capacity building streams.

Provincial Homelessness Grants Deadline: Ongoing

The Social Planning and Research Council of BC (SPARC BC) <u>Homelessness</u> <u>Community Action Grant</u> provides one-time funding for local planning and collaborative initiatives designed to better respond to the needs of those who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. Funding supports community-based action including demonstration projects, partnerships, research, and other collaborative efforts.



Welcome Home Kits Deadline: Ongoing

<u>New Welcome Home Kits</u> provide household items and essential supplies to individuals and families throughout the province as they transition into more stable housing.
