Funding opportunities

IMAGINE Community Grants (Northern Health)

Deadline: May 16, 2025

The <u>Northern Health IMAGINE Community Grant</u> supports community-based projects with a focus on mental wellness, community diversity, harm reduction, climate health action, food security, active living, and/or community safety. Northern BC community organizations, schools, Indigenous organizations, and local government are eligible to apply for grants of up to \$10,000.

2 Billion Trees Program (Government of Canada)

Deadlines: May 15, 2025, and September 18, 2025.

Learn more about the <u>2 Billion Trees (2BT) program</u> and apply today. The 2BT program will process and assess proposals based on the submission date and provide decisions at specific intervals. There are two different streams: 1.) Tree Planting Stream: for organizations, including for-profit organizations and non-profit organizations interested in tree planting projects, and 2.) Indigenous Funding Stream: for Indigenous governments/communities/organizations interested in tree planting and/or capacity building projects.

FireSmart Pilot Program for Regional District Cooperative Community Wildfire Response Organizations (Union of BC Municipalities)

Deadline: May 30, 2025

<u>The FireSmart Pilot Program</u> provides funding to regional districts in BC to increase community resiliency, and to help build a cooperative pathway for wildfire response by providing training and purchasing personal protective equipment for areas without structural fire protection.

Active Transportation Planning program grants (Union of BC Municipalities) Deadline: September 30, 2025

Local governments with populations under 25,000 can <u>apply</u> for up to \$30,000 for active transportation planning.

First Nation Funding Grants - New Relationship Trust Deadline: December 05, 2025 (or when funds are exhausted) Opening: May 13, 2025

The <u>Youth Grant</u> program provides funding to youth groups in First Nation communities to support inclusiveness, belonging, physical and mental well-being, cultural, traditional, creative, and entrepreneurial activities.

The <u>K-12 Education Grant</u> program provides funding for First Nation Kindergarten to Grade 12 classes to support learning environments that support them to aspire to and experience greater opportunities for higher educational outcomes.



The <u>Language Grant</u> program provides funding to First Nation communities for initiatives that revitalize First Nation languages and supports activities that build capacity to encourage and create new fluent speakers.

The <u>Elder Grant</u> program provides funding to elder groups in First Nation communities to improve access, experiences, and activities for maintaining inclusion, belonging, cultural, emotional, mobility, health, and physical well-being.

The <u>Nation Building program</u> provides multi-year funding to First Nations and Tribal Councils to support their nation building activities. Eligible projects and initiatives include those that are meant to strengthen the institutional, governance, and community capacities.

Local Community Accessibility Grants (SPARC BC)

Deadline: Ongoing until March 2026

Municipalities and regional districts in BC can <u>apply</u> for up to \$25,000 to support persons with disabilities. This funding helps remove barriers identified by local government Accessibility Committees or Accessibility Plans.

Regional Homebuilding Innovation Initiative (Government of Canada)

Deadline: March 31, 2026, or when funding is fully exhausted This <u>initiative</u> supports the residential homebuilding supply chain in BC. It advances innovative homebuilding solutions and boosts manufacturing efficiency.

Homelessness Community Action Grants Program (SPARC BC)

Deadline: Ongoing

Apply for one-time <u>funding</u> to support local planning and collaborative initiatives that address the needs of those who are homeless or at risk of homelessness.

Northern Healthy Communities Fund (Northern Development Initiative Trust) Deadline: Ongoing

If your community is nearby an LNG Canada or Coastal GasLink project, apply for the <u>Northern Healthy Communities Fund</u> to help manage the economic growth from major development projects.
