Creating Healthy Public Policy: Equitable Extreme Heat Planning Webinar

On August 18, BC Healthy Communities hosted the webinar, "Creating Healthy Public Policy: Equitable Extreme Heat Planning". If you missed the webinar, featuring our team member, Jeff Kormos (<u>Advisor, Healthy Settings</u> – Northern Interior), you can download the slides and listen to the recording on the PlanH <u>website</u>. This session aimed to help communities plan for, and respond to, the next extreme heat event in northern BC.

Climate change-related extreme weather patterns are becoming less predictable throughout the changing seasons. Northern BC has experienced an increase in weather-related emergencies with the 2017 and 2018 recordbreaking wildfires and emergency evacuations, and the fatal heat dome in 2021. There is a growing need for northern communities to establish emergency preparedness and response plans for extreme heat events.

Funding Opportunities

NutritionLink Services Society 2022-2023 Granting Program Deadline: September 9, 2022

NutritionLink Services Society (NLS) is distributing grants for food literacy programming to registered charities, and First Nations and municipal governments in BC. Visit the NutritionLink webpage for more details and the application form.



Federal Local Food Infrastructure Fund Deadline: October 1, 2022 to December 31, 2023

The <u>FireSmart Community Funding & Supports program</u> provides funding to local governments and First Nations in BC to increase community resiliency by undertaking community based FireSmart planning and activities that reduce the community's risk from wildfire. There is a webinar scheduled on October 13 to help returning and new applicants understand the changes to the program. Please <u>register</u> in advance.

Indigenous Cultural Safety and Cultural Humility Training Deadline: November 25, 2022

<u>Funding</u> is available for local governments and First Nations in BC to provide emergency management personnel with cultural safety and humility training, to partner with and assist Indigenous communities during emergency mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery.

Northern Healthy Communities Fund Deadline: Ongoing

Eligible local governments, First Nations and non-profit organizations that provide supports and services to people in expanding communities near the Coastal Gaslink and LNG Canada projects can apply for project funding through the Northern Healthy Communities Fund. Since its beginning, 46 projects have received funding totalling more than \$5 million.

Indigenous Climate Health Action Program Deadline: Ongoing

Indigenous Climate Health Action Program (ICHAP) funds climate action projects that are community driven and focus on health and wellness outcomes. ICHAP is now accepting expressions of interest for projects starting spring 2023 onward.

Government of Canada: Natural Infrastructure Fund Deadline: Ongoing

The Government of Canada is accepting applications for new projects through the <u>Small Projects Stream of the Natural Infrastructure Fund (NIF)</u>. The \$200 million NIF supports building community awareness of the value of natural infrastructure. It will bring noticeable benefits to communities across Canada by improving access to nature, providing cleaner air and water, protecting and preserving biodiversity and wildlife habitats and mitigating carbon emissions.



Reaching Home – BC Rural and Remote Homelessness Strategy Deadline: Ongoing

The <u>BC Rural and Remote Homelessness Strategy Funding</u> is available to communities who are not currently part of an existing Reaching Home funding program, to support projects that reduce and prevent homelessness. Eligible projects can run between April 1, 2022 and March 31, 2023.

ChildCare BC New Spaces Fund Deadline: When funding runs out

The <u>ChildCareBC New Spaces Fund</u> provides funding to create new licensed child care, helping families access, affordable, quality, and inclusive child care as a core service they can depend on, while strengthening communities throughout British Columbia.
